

Paris's cultural attractions are benefiting from the recovery in tourist numbers

Paris's cultural attractions welcomed 70.2 million visitors in 2017. That is an increase of 5.9% compared to 2016¹. This performance is characterized by strong growth in foreign visitors. It illustrates the recovery in tourism in the capital, which saw a record number of hotel arrivals in 2017.

The survey of cultural visitors, carried out each year by the Paris Convention and Visitors Bureau (PCVB), looks at data on visitor numbers to Paris museums and monuments (permanent collections and exhibitions) over the past year. The survey of the year 2017 covers visitor numbers for 62 cultural attractions and 68 temporary exhibitions.

Visitor statistics for museums and monuments in 2017

The cathedral of Notre-Dame de Paris and the Sacré-Coeur Basilica of Montmartre are the two most visited monuments in the capital with 12 million and 10 million visitors respectively, in 2017. In third place was the **Louvre Museum**, which saw renewed growth with more than 8 million visitors, up by 14.8% compared to 2016. It remains the most visited museum in the world. The **Eiffel Tower**, with 6.2 million visitors in 2017 (+ 4.6%), crossed the symbolic mark of ... 300 million visitors since the World Fair of 1889.

Total attendance for the cultural attractions considered in this survey was 70.2 million visitors, an increase of 5.9% compared to 2016.

Two elements can explain the success achieved this year.

- Firstly, an attractive cultural programme. Temporary exhibitions play a key role in the annual variations in attendance. Cultural attractions recorded significant rises, like the Grand Palais (+ 24.9%) due to the success of 'Gauguin, The Alchemist' (467,378 visitors); the Petit Palais (+ 32.2%) with the exhibitions 'The Art of Pastel, from Degas to Redon' (239,472 visitors) and 'Anders Zorn, Sweden's Master Painter' (130,090 visitors); or the Fondation François Sommer Musée de la Chasse et de la Nature (+68.7 %) with 'Beau doublé, Monsieur le Marquis' (94,821 visitors).
- Cultural attractions also benefited from a favourable tourism climate. Hotels in Grand Paris
 recorded 23.6 million arrivals in 2017, a new annual record. Foreign arrivals increased
 significantly, up 15.2% compared to 7.5% for French arrivals. The same trend can be seen at
 cultural sites with an increase in foreign visitors of 9.7% compared to 4.7% for French visitors.

¹ We have data for the total number of visitors to 62 sites in 2017. But the comparison with 2016 (+5.9 %) is based on 58 sites of which we have data for 2017 and 2016.

The survey also provides information on visitor numbers from the Ile-de-France region, on seasonal variations in visitor numbers, and on the number of group and individual visitors.

Visitor statistics for temporary exhibitions

Some 10.2 million visits were recorded in 2017 for 68 temporary exhibitions at 25 Parisian cultural attractions. 19 exhibitions with more than 200,000 visitors were recorded (7.0 million visitors and 69.0% of the number of entries.).

The exhibition 'Being Modern. MoMA in Paris', at the **Fondation Louis Vuitton**, was the most visited exhibition in Greater Paris in 2017 (755,184 visitors). Two other exhibitions attracted more than 500,000 visitors: 'Christian Dior, couturier du rêve' (708,000 visitors) at the **MAD – Musée des Arts Décoratifs** and the 'David Hockney' retrospective (620,945 visitors) at the **Centre Pompidou**.
